School Targets

- Increase the percent of students passing the English PARCC/MCAP-(earning a 4 or 5) from 65.1 (16/17 school year to 85% by the 2020-2021 school year. In 2018-2019 we were at 74.3% proficient. Our action plan will include to improve the overall reading and writing skills of all PHS students.
- Move more students who are academically ineligible to become academically eligible; academically eligible students will become honor roll students; honor roll students will earn high honor roll status.

Strategies

- **Student Voice Initiative (SVI)** aims to develop the whole student both academically and emotionally by fostering an environment that welcomes student differences and voices.
- PHS partners with Equal Opportunity Schools to intentionally approach creating greater access for underrepresented populations to enroll in Advanced Placement courses.
- PHS has developed a plan to address disproportionality in discipline via a Disproportionality Plan.
 - Staff and Student Equity Trainings aim to empower students and educators to remove the impact of bias and inequity in our spheres of influence. Our staff and students will participate in two books studies this year – Staff- "What if I say the Wrong Thing" Staff & Students – "Look Both Ways".
 - PHS is a Positive Behavior Interventions and Strategies (PBIS) school and focuses on conflict-resolution through restorative practices and trauma-based trainings.

- PHS is working to devise a plan to recruit students for College and Career-Ready courses, such as Advanced Placement (AP), Career and Technology (CTA) pathways, and Dual-Enrollment courses so that all students graduate with skills or courses that can be applied in life after high school.
- Summer AP Bootcamps are available annually to help first-time and repeat AP students develop the skills necessary to persevere through a rigorous workload. This course also promotes critical reading and writing skills. In the summer of 2020, the bootcamp will be conducted virtually.
- A Seminar for Advanced Studies course is available for first-time AP students, as well as students challenging themselves in their courseloads. This course also emphasizes study skills and critical reading and writing skills.
- Professional development and collaborative planning-periods for teachers allow the continuation of our cross disciplinary writing focus.
- Academic and MCAP interventions such as during school courses, twilight courses, enrichment courses, after school-tutoring, writing labs, and Saturday School are available to students who need additional supports.
- Student Leadership opportunities are widely available through organizations such as SGA, Student Senate, and Place at the Table, Key Club, Family Meeting Team, SVI, and more.
